



WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECKS INFORMATION SESSIONS



The Department for Child Protection will be conducting Information sessions for Employers, Self-employed and Volunteer Coordinators, 26th August Bunbury.

Under Western Australian law, many people who carry out child-related work, either **paid, unpaid or voluntary**, must obtain a Working With Children Card.

Schools, sports and service clubs, counselling and support services, child care, entertainment, churches, children's health services, school buses, tutoring and babysitting are some examples of areas where people may come under this legislation.

Separate sessions are being run to provide information on what employers, self-employed people and volunteer coordinators need to know to comply with the legislation, how to renew a Check, how to create child safe environments and answer questions you may have.
